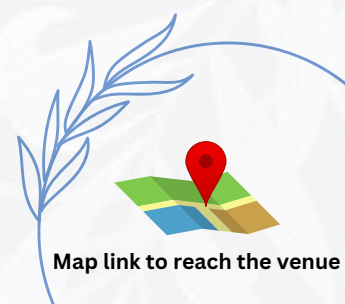

Kaziranga Golf Resort

It is a heritage tea estate bungalow with a unique course in the midst of a tea garden which is the first of its kind in the world, developed on 150- acre land golf and an excellent choice for travelers visiting Jorhat.



Rang Ghar

Located in Sivasagar, Rang Ghar meaning "House of Entertainment" is a two storied building built in 1746 during the reign of Swargadeo Pramatta Singha. The building served as a royal sports-pavilion from Ahom kings & nobles during the Rongali Bihu.



Kaziranga National Park

It is one of the India's National treasures. The park is located in the districts of Golaghat and Nagaon about 110 kilometres from Jorhat town. It is a home to two-thirds of the world's greater one-horned rhinoceros.



Thengal Manor

It is located in a traditional Assamese village named Jalukonibari, About 15 km away from Jorhat town, the majestic mansion to visit. Home to the affluent and aristocratic, the Khongiya Barooah family of Upper Assam, are known for their nobility, philanthropy, and tea plantations.



Kareng Ghar

Located in Sivasagar, Kareng Ghar, a Royal house of the Tai-Ahom kings was built between 1696 and 1714 under the direction of King Rudra Singha. Later, King Rajeswara Singha constructed a few more stories to the palace, making it a seven-story palace.



Sukapha Samannay Kshetra

A must visit place and museum for history lovers of Ahom dynasty. It housed the traditional and modern cultural heritage of Assam. It's just a few kilometres away from the event location.



Shiva Dol

Located in Sivasagar, Shiva Dol means Lord Shiva temple, is one of the popular tourist destinations in the state of Assam. Built in Shikhara architecture, it is the tallest Shiva temple in the country with a height of 104 feet.



Talatal Ghar

Located in Sivasagar, Talatal Ghar, is the grandest and biggest of all Ahom monuments and epitomizes Ahom power at its zenith. The place was initially built as an army base rather than a residential palace.



Majuli

Majuli is a mysterious place steeped in culture and ancient history. It is located on the mighty Brahmaputra River at about 40 km from the Jorhat town. Being the world's largest river island, it is home to Sattriya culture.
