Colloquium Lecture held at CSIR-NEIST

PhD students also presented their poster to Dr. Popescu and discussed their work and got some valuable suggestions and comments about their on-going research activities and possible collaboration with Dr. Popescu lab and scientific visit in future. Dr. Popescu was also visited the central instrumentation facility at Bhatnagar Building and she was truly impressed with the high-end equipment and overall research facility of the Institute.
